


Bill Pugh celebrates 51 years as an ordained minister




New Sunday School Class for 1st-5th Graders


OUR MISSION: As an innovative learning community, grounded in faith, Bethany empowers every student to lead through spiritual engagement, academic excellence, and service to others.

Bethany Theological Seminary is committed to helping all qualified students to answer their call from God and receive an exceptional education without taking on additional educational or consumer debt. As many seminaries have struggled with enrollment, our vibrant community has grown — and we have room for more students, both studying from a distance or joining our on-campus community and living in our “Neighborhood” of houses a few steps from campus.

In recent years the Seminary has dramatically reduced total student borrowing, even as enrollment has grown. Participants in our Pillars and Pathways Residential Scholars program receive reduced tuition, free housing, living stipends, work opportunities, and a course in Conscious Financial Living with a goal of helping students earn Bethany degrees without taking on additional student or consumer debt.




Currently supported: 13 students

Pastor's Column

SAVE THE DATE!!!! Congregational Retreat – February 3-5, 2023

Before you read any farther, reserve February 3-5 on both your appointment calendar and your prayer calendar and make plans to participate in our upcoming congregational retreat. But first, let's back up just a bit...



I began my Pastor's Report at last spring's Council Meeting by playing a few measures of Cher's song, *If I could turn back time*. My question for you that day was, "If you could go back in time to when things were 'normal,' what year would you choose?" Many of you mentioned 2019 or 2020, as that was prior to the Covid-19 pandemic. Several persons specifically mentioned the retreat with Paul Munday held in February 2020.

That was a particularly energetic season in our life together. Our enthusiasm was high; the creation of a new young adult Sunday School class resulted in Sunday School attendance regularly touching the low 90's; and there was a growing good spirit around our Love Feast. As we all know, the pandemic has left us rebuilding congregational life. We've worked hard on that over the past 18 months, and this retreat is designed to help continue those efforts.

Our retreat leader is Brian Messler, pastor of the Ephrata (PA) Church of the Brethren. Brian has served Church of the Brethren congregations for many years—including serving as an Associate Pastor at Frederick (MD) Church of the Brethren when Paul Munday was pastor. Brian is energetic, innovative, and passionate in his love of Jesus, and the Ephrata congregation is both growing in number and is growing younger. The congregation is active in the community in ways that we will find familiar. Brian and I have had several conversations about how we will spend our time together. We will continue to fine tune the topics around several questions:

- How does the phrase *Jesus in the Oak Grove neighborhood* shape our imagination?
- What does commitment look like in post-pandemic congregational life?
- How do we connect with younger persons?
- How do we shift from service ministries to disciple-making ministries?

I look forward to how God will work in and through us in the next season of our life.
