

# Pastor's Column

#### Congregational Retreat – February 3-5, 2023

Nearing the end of his life, the Apostle Paul offered this reflection on his ministry:

I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith (2 Timothy 4:7).



This is a tremendous affirmation of faith. Paul's dramatic encounter with Jesus transformed him from a persecutor of the church into its greatest missionary and theologian. Paul gave the remainder of his life to travelling throughout the Roman world, sharing the gospel, planting churches, calling leaders, and confronting unrighteousness. Importantly, he can pass the baton to the next

generation because those churches and leaders will continue the work.

Like a compelling Olympic relay race, the baton of faith has continued to be passed down through the generations. Our own congregation has witnessed the baton being passed from a group of Brethren from the Peters Creek congregation who began ministry in the Oak Grove community in the early 1900's, to some of your hands in the 1960's when our congregation built our current meeting house. Now the baton is in our hands. As we run our leg of the relay of faith, how are we preparing to pass the baton to those who will follow us?

In a sermon last fall, I posed the following scenario as one way for us to consider the work of this generation. As we approach our congregational retreat, I share it again for your consideration:

Imagine it's the year 2048—25 years from now. Think about the children and youth who are part of our congregation today, and imagine that they're still here in 2048, serving as deacons, board chairs, preachers, and music leaders. As they prepare for a congregational retreat, what decisions might we make *now* that will be celebrated *then*?

There are a few of you here who might reasonably expect to be here with your children in 25 years. Can you imagine a Sunday dinner when one of your now adult children asks, "How did our church come to make the decisions that brought us here?" Your answer might go something like this: "Let me tell you about 2020—when we had an encouraging congregational retreat that was followed by a pandemic and some very divisive politics in our nation. When things returned to normal, we realized that much of what we had been so excited about in early 2020 wasn't working so well, and we came to see we had some decisions to make: we could continue in the pattern and rhythms that had served us so well for so long, or we could recognize that what got us to the first quarter of 2020 was not going to take us into the future.

We chose to seek the leading of the Spirit in a new way; to trust God and one another; to risk change; to be a church that would serve the needs of our children and grandchildren, even if we would not be alive to see them. We continue to value the traditions that served us for so many years, but our legacy to you was to learn how to be the church in a challenging season. We followed the lead of the denomination to prioritize being Jesus in the Neighborhood, and your presence in church is a testimony to that hard work. Our love for Jesus gave us the strength to embrace our moment and give him the glory forever and ever."

Many of us have different ideas and perspectives and thoughts on this matter. We should hear them all. For me, the most pressing question for today is, "How can we be a church where our children and grandchildren find faith?"
