



Church Board Happenings:

Report by: Alli Yingling

Our Church Board met Sunday, March 12, to discuss the wonderful things that have been going on and are yet to come in our church life. There was a lot of great discussion! Please see below for a quick overview of our meeting:

- New! Development of a "Gifts" Survey is in the works. We want to know where you feel led to serve in our congregation and connect people with similar gifts and passions to pursue ministries together.
- Save the Date! Church Picnic will be at Camp Bethel on July 16, 2023. The pool will be open from 3-5 p.m.. More details to come.
- Heritage Day Discussion At this time, we do not know if Camp Bethel will be hosting Heritage Day or if congregations will sponsor individual events to support camp this year. It has been significantly challenging to find a coordinator for our Cobbler Booth at Camp Bethel for this event, making our Baked Goods Auction a more manageable event this past fall. Please ponder our contribution to Camp Bethel/Heritage Day moving forward.
- Constitution Up-Dates Conversations around restructuring our church leadership model began at the Congregational Retreat in February. We are excited to share some new models with you at the Spring Council Meeting. Be on the look out for more information to come.
- New! Ellen Phillips was enthusiastically affirmed with her involvement in the Roanoke Reparations Group as a representative of Oak Grove.

Strategic Task Team Progress Report:

The Strategic Task Team met four times this winter and offers this progress report. With this report, we will pause meeting to allow this work to be done, and will reconvene later in the year as necessary:

- Highlighted the importance of every member's financial contribution and acknowledged the accumulated impact of many smaller gifts.
- With help from the Financial Secretary and the Finance Commission, we plan to distribute a quarterly Stewardship report to each member of the congregation that provides year-to-date updates on both congregational expenses and the individual person or family's year-to-date giving. The first of these should be available in mid-April.
- Heard a report from the Finance Commission on plans to:
 - -Update the church accounting software.
 - -Examine the numerous special funds we manage and eliminate those that are redundant or are no longer a focus of our ministries. From available unrestricted funds, create a "Longevity Fund" to sustain the program of the church.
- Considered a potential proposal to the church board to authorize a special offering in September if there is a significant shortfall of giving at the end of the summer. No action has been taken on this proposal at this time.
- Discussed various ways of encouraging our members to continue faithful giving and to consider occasional special gifts to the church as the circumstances allow.
- Investigated ways to add a "give now" option to our Facebook Live broadcasts.
- Add Venmo as a second online means of giving.


Updating the Church Constitution? Proposal for Spring Council Meeting

Our congregation has many reasons to be thankful for those who serve in leadership. Whether called as Commission members, Sunday School teachers, Deacons, or volunteers for various events, our leaders work hard and are not afraid of asking if the way we do things is the only or best way to continue the ministry of our congregation.

One of these concerns is our system of church governance. At our February and March Board meetings, the Board heard a proposal to consider revising our Constitution. There are several significant pieces in this discussion:

- Would we be better served by changing to the "Leadership Team" model of church governance approved by the Annual Conference in 2000? That is the subject of this month's article.
- Would it be helpful to reassign the responsibilities of the Evangelism & Membership and Missions & Service Commissions so that we have one outward-focused Commission and one inward-focused Commission? This is a subject for next month's article.
- As the work of the Peace and Justice Group is increasingly relevant to the interests of the congregation, Virlina District, and the Church of the Brethren, how should this group relate to our governing bodies? This also is a subject for next month's article.


The picture included here shows our current church governance structure, which includes a 26-member church board and a 12-member Executive Committee. (A larger copy of this picture is available upon request.) These two groups oversee the work of the various Commissions as they carry out the program of the church and report back to Church Council. We also need persons to serve as Deacons, Sunday School teachers, and help out with other occasional opportunities. Filling all these positions has become more challenging in the last several years, often requiring persons to "wear multiple hats" to ensure the important ministries of our congregation continue.



Our board is to be commended for asking the uncomfortable question:

Is there another way to organize ourselves that might be more effective?

The Annual Conference dealt with this question in 2000 and approved another model of church governance. The major change is that this newer model *eliminates the Church Board and assigns those responsibilities to the <u>Leadership Team</u>. If you look closely, you'll see that the Leadership Team has the same membership as our Executive Committee.*



This seems like a major change, and on paper, it is. In my previous congregation, however, I led the board from the old Executive Committee - Board structure to the new Leadership Team structure. We found that in practice, this change was virtually seamless and served the needs of the congregation well.

The Church Board asked me to include this information in the Newsletter so that you will be informed ahead of our May Council meeting. Here are a few questions you should consider about this proposed change:

Our current Church Board has 26 members. This is approximately 25% of our worship attendance. Do we need this many people overseeing the program of the church? The proposed Leadership Team is a group of 12 members. Is this enough to adequately oversee the program of the church? If not, how large should this governing board be? Who should be on it? What other ways might we ask people to serve our congregation, instead of being on our governing board?

Moving forward, here is a timeline of what you can expect:

May Newsletter: an article describing some other potential changes with this proposal. May Council meeting: consider a motion from the Church Board to revise the Church

Constitution. If that motion is approved, these next steps would in order:

Call a Constitution Revision Committee to begin work.

Schedule Council Meetings/Information session for approximately late June and late August to report progress and answer any questions.

Schedule a called Council Meeting sometime in September to potentially approve changes.

It is likely that you will have questions about this. Please feel free to reach out to Pastor Tim for more information.
