

Pastor's Column

Piecing it all together

The richness of congregational life impacts us through the mutual sharing of spiritual gifts, talents, and personal interests. The metaphor of the many contributing to the whole offers a significant understanding of our life together:



- Biblically, the church is described as a body where each part is essential to the functioning of the whole. We see a description of this in Acts 4:34 where we read, "There was not a needy person among them" because of the loving, generous financial sharing of the believers.
- Perhaps we imagine our congregation as a delicious stew (we do love to eat!), with each person's gift making a significant contribution to the overall flavor.
- Our Moments for Mission this past spring gave us the chance to see the various aspects of congregational ministry as puzzle pieces. Each piece by itself is significant, yet the entire picture is only revealed as all the pieces are joined together.

Whichever metaphor you prefer, the point remains that our congregational life depends on each one's time, talent, and treasure being offered to the benefit of the whole as we together pursue life in Christ. No one of us carries the entire load; each one contributes their portion, and together, we find much strength and love.

September and October are significant times in our church life, as we together discern the church budget for the next year. More than numbers on a page, the individual line items in the budget represent opportunities for someone to meet Jesus, grow in the faith, have a need met, and take their place in the Kingdom of God.



Our leadership began the budgeting process in our August Executive Committee meeting. Our six Commissions and Deacon Board are making their proposals to be considered by the full Church Board. The final budget will be presented for approval at our Fall Council meeting on Sunday, October 15.

Between now and then, be on the lookout for these things to help us with this process:

- Colorful puzzle pieces will appear at various places around the church over the next several Sundays. Each piece represents an aspect of our congregational life and will help tell the story about how our various ministries impact us. These will be shaped by the information you shared during the Moments for Mission earlier this spring.
- Pledge cards and a draft budget will go out in the next few weeks and will be due back on Sunday, October 1. This will be the second year in a row that we have asked for pledge cards to be returned prior to the Fall Council meeting. Our purpose is to build a historical record of how much our congregation pledges, so that we may better anticipate giving trends. You responded faithfully to this last year, and I hope you will do the same again this year.

I encourage you to continue your diligent prayers and service to our congregation, as we *Continue the Work of Jesus: Peacefully, Simply, Together.*
