


#### Women's Bible Study



## Carry Your Cross — A closer look at Holy Week Winter 2024 Men's Bible Study — Wednesdays @ 6:00 p.m.

When the Apostle Paul proclaimed the Gospel to the church in Corinth approximately 25 years after Jesus' resurrection, his message focused on the cross: "we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles" (1 Corinthians 1:23). Beginning the sermon by essentially saying, "I know none of you are going to believe this, but..." doesn't seem like an effective strategy!

With a message like this, how could first century Christians—or 21<sup>st</sup> century Christians—expect to attract converts? And yet they did. Within 300 years of Jesus' resurrection, the followers of this so-called foolish Gospel of a crucified Savior had gone from being a largely ignored religious sect within Judaism to being outlawed and occasionally persecuted to overtaking the Roman Empire.

How might a fresh look at Jesus' actions, encounters, teachings, and sufferings on Holy Week help us follow him in our lives? Lets open our Bibles and learn together!



### Pastor's Column

The new year brings the predictable small talk about resolutions, self-improvement, gym memberships, diets, and other goals which we've all, at various times, planned for, joked about, and experienced mixed success in fulfilling. But the fact is that we do mark time by the passage of days, months, and years, and flipping the calendar from December 31 to January 1

does invite a certain amount of self-reflection.

We'll begin the new year with four sermons taken from the Gospel texts in the Revised Common Lectionary. In my own preparation, I see two themes merging in these four texts: an invitation into



the desert for self-reflection to refocus on what I'm calling *First Things*: experiences with Jesus that are foundational to our faith.

The picture that accompanies the worship theme is a panoramic photo that I took when we visited Rose in Portland during her BVS year. We hiked one morning on the "Lyle Cherry Orchard Trail" about an hour east of the city and were treated to this magnificent view of the Columbia River and the beautiful terrain of the countryside—once we'd made our way to the top of the ridge. It was a warm respite from the pressures of life, and invited reflection on the beauty of creation and the God who created it all.

You might have noticed a new piece of furniture in the vestibule. Noel Naff commissioned this table for our recent Virlina District Conference. Brother Noel is deeply concerned about the great amount of division in our world and especially in our beloved Church of the Brethren. He approached me about this design as a symbol for how our faith in Jesus is strong enough to bring us together across




our divisions. The table was used in worship on Friday evening of District Conference, and as part of the worship center on Saturday.

Most of the walnut came from lumber Dennis Shearer gave to me when they moved into their current home. The live edge on this board adds a unique beauty to this design. I believe we will enjoy using this table for years to come.
