

#### **Backpack Ministry Program**



Our Backpack Ministry program has just completed its 11th year of donating food bags to students in need at Oak Grove Elementary School. We'd like to express our gratitude to all those who have contributed money and food items, as well as to the volunteers whose assistance with packing the bags has been invaluable in keeping the program running smoothly.





## Pastor's Column

I wrote this article on behalf of the Gun Violence Prevention Commission for Roanoke churches and other non-profit organizations to include in their newsletters.

As a suicide and gun theft prevention measure, the City of Roanoke and the Roanoke Police Department recently purchased 10,000 gun locks that are available free of charge to citizens of Roanoke. If you are a gun owner, please consider securing your handgun with one of these free gun locks.

Impulsivity is a significant factor in many of Roanoke's gun suicides and homicides. For every one gun homicide, Roanoke usually experiences one or more gun suicides. An unexpected event can fill a person with despair, fear, or anger, causing them to make an impulsive, life-altering decision for themselves and others because a gun is readily available.

Many injuries and deaths could be avoided with just the simplest obstacle—a gun lock—standing between the impulse of the moment and the act of pulling the trigger. For instance, the suicide risk for teenagers who live in a home with handguns can be reduced by 50% when guns are locked, unloaded, and the ammunition kept in a separate place. By contrast, women who live in a home where her spouse or partner owns a gun experience a 50% increase in suicide risk.
