Westside Elementary Book Project Update



Pastor's Column

Finding God in the Music 2024

But why *Finding God in the Music*? Why start the sermon from secular songs? This sermon series has its

roots in a missionary conversation recorded in the book of Acts. When Paul arrived in Athens (Acts 17:16-34) he had some time on his hands. Having gotten into legal trouble for preaching the Gospel in Thessalonica—and having been chased out of Berea by some of the same ne'er-do-wells that had followed him from Thessalonica—Paul didn't have much to do as he waited for Silas and Timothy to join him. So, he went for a walk. What he saw distressed him greatly.

Athens was a very cosmopolitan city with many statues dedicated to the ancient Greek gods. Everywhere Paul went, he found statues that paid homage to the Greek gods that we learned about in elementary and middle school. By some accounts, Athens contained nearly 30,000 of these statues—one ancient historian says that it was easier to find a statue in Athens than it was to find a man!

One statue in particular caught Paul's eye—a statue dedicated to "an unknown God" (Acts 17:23). This was the foothold Paul needed. Debating with some Epicurean and Stoic philosophers and seeking to win them to Christ, Paul tells them that he knows the God to whom this statue is dedicated. To help bridge the gap between the Gospel and these philosophers who know nothing of the God of the Bible, Paul quotes their own poets: "In him we live and move and have our being" and "for we, too, are his offspring" (Acts 17:28). Paul engages in *theopoetics*—using (in this case) secular poetry as a source of conversation and common ground for the purpose of talking about God—hence the name *theopoetics*: *God-poetry*. *Finding God in the Music* is another form of theopoetics; in this case, as a means to talk about the ways we are longing for deeper connection.

Are there ways that secular songs are reaching for God in the same way the "statue to an unknown God" was in Athens? And hearing these songs, can we link the ideas, images, and metaphors to Scriptural truth? That will be our attempt. I look forward to your thoughts on the songs and Scriptures we will encounter.
