

Report from the September 8 Executive Committee Meeting

- Fall Council Meeting has been rescheduled for October 27, 2024 to accommodate the use of our facilities for the Bazaar and Community Festival October 19, 2024.
- We anticipate several items of business for the Fall Council meeting. More information on each of the items will be available between now and Council meeting:
- ♦ A motion regarding the Leadership Team Model we have been trialing this year.
- A motion originating from the Peace and Justice Group regarding funding for several outreach opportunities in our community (see related article in this month's newsletter).
- ♦ The 2025 proposed budget.
- ♦ The 2025 proposed slate of officers.
- We continue discussions on how to make our building more welcoming to all. This includes:
- Making the building accessible on rainy days for those with mobility needs. Property has been looking into covered entrance options for our handicap accessible entrances.
- ♦ Christian Education has been working with Property to establish a covering for the lower "Ark" playground, as it gets too hot in the summer for our littlest disciples.
- You may have noticed the bathrooms in the fellowship hall have been converted into unisex facilities to increase accessibility to these handicap accessible bathrooms.
- Non-slip strips have been added to outdoor staircases for safety.
- We are planning for a November 10th Board Retreat, including all 2024 and 2025 elected and appointed commission members. The goal will be to strategically plan for the coming year. Exciting times lie ahead!

We will commemorate *All Saints Sunday* on November 3, 2024 with a memorial tribute video. The tribute to Oak Grove members and participants who died in the last twelve months has quickly become a meaningful tradition for our congregation.

Conversations that continued after our grief seminar earlier this year have led us to expand the memorial tribute video. If you would like to add members of your immediate family who have died since November 2023

Peace and Justice Ministries in our community

Our Spring 2021 Council meeting was certainly one for the ages! Even though Covid shut down most congregational ministries throughout 2020 and into 2021, your financial support of the congregation remained unchanged. As a result of your faithfulness, the congregation ended 2020 with a significant financial surplus that was used to support our mission in the Roanoke Valley and beyond.

Part of that Council decision was setting aside \$8,000 for the Roanoke Reparations Group (RRG), a project that originated from Central Church of the Brethren's Race Education Team. Their vision was to bring together churches in the Roanoke area to pursue faith-based reparations for the Black community in Roanoke. Today, the RRG is focused on raising awareness about the need to address and repair the damage done by systemic racism, while also working to recruit churches to support this cause. The RRG has hosted book studies on the topic of reparations and is currently developing a database of recommended resources to assist churches in starting their educational journey. Representatives from various churches gather monthly to work toward these goals; Ellen Phillips and Deanna Knox are involved with this group.

The Peace and Justice Committee brought a recommendation for allocating \$3,091 of this fund for three projects listed below. This proposal has been approved by the Missions and Service Commission and the Executive Committee. It is an item on the October 27th Church Council agenda.

\$1,000 to FEDUP. Our congregation is familiar with Families Experiencing Deliverance Using Prayer, a 501(c)3 organization connected with Roanoke's Gun Violence Prevention Commission. FEDUP volunteers connect with the families of homicide victims to provide immediate crisis and conflict-resolution resources, as well as any other support needed. FEDUP also sponsors a monthly support group for both gun violence survivors and for victims' families.

\$1,091 to Roanoke Justice Ministries (RJM), a non-partisan, multi-leader, multi-racial, interfaith community organization seeking to end racism and poverty in the Roanoke Valley. This organization seeks to mobilize the faith community to bring attention to civic leaders about these concerns. The proposal includes a \$1,000 gift to RJM and \$91 for reimbursements for Oak Grove members who have attended training and education events.

\$1,000 to Young Doctors of Roanoke, a mentoring, education, and pipeline to health careers program for high school boys that includes intensive summer programs and Saturday academies where participants are trained in preventative medicine, mental health, and health issues in underserved communities. The program includes help with the travel arrangements and accommodations for the annual four-week Summer Academy at Howard University.

Any young man of color from grade 8 to 10 is eligible to apply to the program each year. Why only young men? The program has chosen to focus on men because statistics show the medical field is attracting fewer young men of color than young women of color. Healing Crafts by Tess Anderson

This summer I had the opportunity to work with Robin Moorman, a participant in the FEDUP program. FEDUP is a local nonprofit that supports families who have lost a loved one to gun violence. Robin's adult son, Robbie, was killed last year.

When a family like the Moorman's experience a loss, a FEDUP team goes to their house to offer support and help with resources for things like funeral arrangements, clergy, financial assistance, food and housing. They especially offer prayer. And their support is ongoing through the months ahead. These teams are made up of people who have, themselves, experienced the kind of traumatic loss that comes from gun violence. They bring with them an understanding that goes beyond words, that can allow a person to talk if they wish or simply be with someone who has walked this same painful road.

Robin wished for a quilt she could wrap up in, made from her son's clothes, surrounded by the feel of the things her beloved son wore. Her FEDUP team contacted Tim, who then asked our craft group if anyone would be interested in making it. That's how I came to work with Robin. It was a privilege to talk with her and make the quilt, one small part of the support that has come through the FEDUP organization.
