
Pastor's Column

Oak Grove's Top Hymns

Oak Grove's Top 40 has been a fantastically rewarding project to work on, and I hope you share my excitement for the ways the top three hymns will shape our worship in November. We'll experience those hymns through vocal and instrumental music, while the theology and images of the hymn lyrics will inform the sermon and spoken parts of our worship liturgy.

Our favorite hymns are a non-scientific compilation of responses submitted by 52 Oak Grove members—a list of responses that generated **173 unique hymns**! Each hymn was given 10 points for first place, 9 points for second place, etc. and the total scores tabulated and ranked.

This is a rather subjective list. My hunch is that while many are certain about their favorite hymn, it is difficult to justify why one hymn might be #5 on our list, and another hymn #8. And that is just fine. Mostly this is just a great deal of fun.



It is interesting, though, to consider the hymns we chose as our congregational "favorites." Are you surprised in any way? I am! In a sermon this summer, I mentioned that I thought the hymn *Come, Thou fount of every blessing* would probably be one of our top 5 or 10 most favorite hymns. I was wrong about that: it came in at #12! (It's #3 on my personal list.)
