Guided Hike and Trail Mix Bar: Take a hike around camp (easy to moderate skill level) and learn fun facts about nature while snacking on your trail mix.



### Pastor's Column

This is an article about congregational giving...but it might not seem that way for a while! The Blue Ridge Marathon is a crown jewel outdoor event of the Roanoke Valley, attracting participants and their family members from across the United States. I've completed the half-marathon five times, each time pacing myself to average 9 minutes per mile for the race. That is a doable pace, and the math is easy to keep track of while I run. Each time I pass a mile marker, I look at my watch and calculate how far I am ahead of or (mostly) behind pace.

But because the course is so hilly, *I never actually run a 9-minute mile*! I'm always faster or slower than this. The course begins in front of the Patrick Henry Hotel and proceeds south on Jefferson Street, turning left on Walnut Ave. That's about as flat as Roanoke gets, and I'm faster than 9 minutes for that mile. But then the course heads up to the Mill Mountain Star, and when I arrive there I'm generally about two minutes behind my pace. Not to worry, though, because I'll make up all that time (and then some) running down Mill Mountain and then along the Greenway to River's Edge Park. But next comes Avenham Avenue, Peakwood Drive, and West Ridge Road—some of the steepest hills in Roanoke. When I finally reach the cul-du-sac at the top of West Ridge, I'm behind my pace again. On and on it goes until I cross the finish line, stop the timer on my watch, and check my race pace.

So you're probably wondering, what does this have to do with congregational giving? It's this: our monthly giving patterns are as uneven as my mile-splits in the Blue Ridge Half-Marathon, even as we meet our yearly congregational financial commitments. Just because our year-to-date giving might have us "in the red" in a given month doesn't mean we aren't on pace to meet our goal. Thinking again about the Blue Ridge Half-Marathon, after the first year I realized I can't panic when I reach mile 11 and am 90 or more seconds slower than my target pace, because the final two miles are some of the fastest of the race. In each of the five races, I've always finished a few seconds faster than 9 minutes per mile.

In general, January, October, November, and December are our biggest giving months, while June and September are some of our lowest. As you read our financial reports in the bulletin and newsletter, remember that just because we appear to be behind our giving doesn't mean we won't be on track at the end.



We are a financially faithful and generous congregation. Thank you for both your regular giving and your special gifts: those that come in the offering plate, as memorial gifts, contributions to the *Acorn Fund*, or purchases made at the Yard Sale or Bazaar. It takes all of us, each doing our part, to continue the effective ministry of our congregation.
