Betty Wills Retirement Party



Trex Recycling Challenge



A project started by Mike Elmore which has yielded one bench so far..

The Trex Challenge is a plastic film recycling program organized by Trex Company. Trex is a company that manufactures composite decking and outdoor furniture using 95% recycled materials, including plastic film.

How the Trex Challenge works:

Participants: Schools and community organizations are encouraged to participate. Collection: Participants collect plastic bags and film.

Goal: The challenge is to collect at least 1,000 pounds of plastic film within a 12-month period. Some sources also mention a 500-pound goal within a six-month period.

Reporting: Participants weigh and record the collected plastic film and report the totals to Trex.

Drop-off: The collected plastic film is delivered to participating retailers for recycling.

Rewards: If the collection goal is met, Trex awards the organization with a bench made from recycled plastic.

Pastor's Column

My preaching calendar for the remainder of 2025 is filling up rapidly. We may only be halfway through the year, but—believe it or not—Advent is only three sermon series away!

Next month in this space you'll read about the songs and Scriptures for *Finding God in the Music, Volume 3*. Stay tuned (pun intended)!

September brings our annual Stewardship emphasis and pledge card commitments. It's not too early to begin thinking about your ongoing support for our congregation. But again, more about that later.



The sermon series that occupies the most Sundays between now and the end of the year is *Stained Glass Sermons*, a series that will interpret the images of the stained glass windows in our sanctuary. The idea for this came from our Men's Bible study group. One evening this Spring, I took the men into the Sanctuary to show them the windows as an illustration of that evening's text. I did not anticipate that we'd spend most of our evening talking about the windows.

It might be that we're so familiar with our beautiful windows that we've stopped "seeing" them. That's understandable, but it's also an

opportunity to bring them back into our collective foreground, enabling them to inspire and encourage us in our faith.

We'll approach the sermon series in a somewhat unusual way; we'll begin on Sunday, July 29, 2025, with a worship service and sermon inspired by the window with musical horns and notes. Other emphases will intervene in August and September;

Stained Glass Sermons will then return in October and November with eight more sermons as we work our way around the Sanctuary.

Between now and then, take a look at our windows. How many of the symbols can you explain? Which ones do you have questions about? Let me know; I'll be glad to work your questions and comments into the sermons.
