



Pastor's Column

Finding God in the Music, Volume 3

Finding God in the Music returns this August with five songs whose lyrics bridge the gap between the frustrations, misguided notions, and brokenness of life and our aspirations that the broken things need not remain that way. Our experiences "east of the sunset" often leave us bruised and questioning. Yet if we just take a moment to consider the sunset, we might begin to wonder what life could be like on the other side. More than this, is it possible to begin living that life now? What changes would make that possible?

The first four songs from this summer's set each tell a story about the consequences of our failed attempts to make life work to our advantage, leaving our hopes, dreams, and aspirations in ruins at our feet. Ross Flora's brand new release, *Cornerstone*, does the work of connecting Scripture with life's struggles for us, guiding us to the One who provides the foundation upon which we can stand.

In contrast, Allison Krauss and Union Station's *Granite Mills* approaches things from the other side, relating the story of the September 19, 1874, Granite Mills fire in Fall River, MA, and leaving us the work of connecting life and faith. These first four songs are available on your preferred music streaming service.

Carefully Taught/Children Will Listen is the musical (but not thematic) outlier in this year's list. This medley features songs from the musicals South Pacific and Into the Woods, powerfully performed by the award-winning barbershop quartet Midtown. You can find this arrangement on YouTube.

One added benefit of this year's sermon series is the live presentation of *Where Rainbows Never Die* (by Oak Grove's bluegrass band) and *Granite Mills* (by Lavinder and Company).
