



Pastor's Column

Men's Bible Study

When I began taking my faith more seriously as a college freshman, the music of Rich Mullins became an important part of my discipleship. I found the songs he sang—mostly from his 1988 album *Winds of Heaven, Stuff of Earth*—to be simultaneously simple and profound, easy to understand yet challenging to live out. Rich Mullins was a musical artist with a poet's heart, a prophet's concern, and a sage's wisdom.



In the years since his untimely death in 1997 (at age 41) the world learned that his songs also came from a place of deep woundedness. Rich had a difficult relationship with his father, and he struggled with both alcohol and depression for years. But he never gave up on Jesus, in part because he believed Jesus never gave up on him. How does this relate to your experience with Jesus?

Our Men's Bible Study will be centered around Rich Mullins' songs and the Scriptures that inspired them. The schedule is below; song titles are in italics. We would be glad for you to join us.
